GLOSSARY VANCLEAVE BAND

TEMPO

Grave - Slow and solemn

Largo - Very slow and dignified

Lento - Slow; not as slow as largo

Adagio - At ease; faster than Lento

Andante - Walking tempo; flowing along

Largamente - Broadly; slow and dignified

Moderato - At a moderate speed

Allegretto - A bit joyful; slower than allegro

Allegro - Lively and fast
Presto - Very fast

Prestissimo - Very very fast; as fast as possible

MOOD / PHRASING

Agitato - Agitated; excited and fast
Animato - Animated; usually quick
Cantabile - Singable; in a singing style
Con brio - With bright; brightly

Con fuoco - With fire; in a fiery manner

Con moto - With movement (of tempo)

Con spirito - Spirited; with spirit

Dolce - Sweetly; usually legato style

Espressivo - Expressively

Maestoso - Majestic; stately

Misterioso - Mysteriously, enigmatic Pesante - Heavy; slowly and sadly Scherzando - Playfully; usually quick

Vivace - Up-tempo; not as fast as presto

TEMPO VARIATIONS

Accelerando - Accelerating; increasingly quicker

Affretando - Becoming hurried; frantic Stringendo - Extreme hurrying of tempo

Rallentando - Slower and slower; progressively

Ritardando - Slowing, decelerating

Rubato - Free flowing; without steady rhythm
Tenuto - Overly sustain; only a few notes
A tempo - Return to previous tempo

L'istesso Temp At the same tempo

COMMON ENGLISH

Repeat - Play marked passage again

Chromatic - Moving by half step

Enharmonic - Written differently, same sound

Sharp - Raises a note a half step Flat - Lowers a note a half step

DYNAMICS / INTENSITY

Pianissimo - Very gentle; very soft

Piano - Gentle; soft Forte - Strong; loud

Fortissimo - Very strong; very loud
Crescendo - Growing; becoming louder
Decrescendo - Shrinking; becoming softer
Diminuendo - Dwindling; becoming softer
Marcato - Marked; played forcefully

Sforzando - Sharply accented

STYLE

Legato - Connected and smooth

Staccato - Distinct and separated

Detache - Between legato and staccato

Portato - Between legato and staccato

Vibrato - Variation in pitch; adds beauty

Glissando - Slide from one note to another

GENERAL / PREFIXES

Assai - Very Con - With

Ma non troppo - But not too much

Meno - Less

Mezzo - Half; medium

Molto - Very

Mosso - Motion; agitation

Piu - More Poco - Little

Poco a Poco - Little by little Senza / Sans - Without

Sordino - A mute

Subito - Suddenly; immediately

DIRECTION / **INSTRUCTION**

Da Capo - Return to the beginning

Del Segno - From the sign

Divisi - Divided into separate parts

Solo - One person plays
Tutti - Entire group plays

Coda - The end section of a piece
Simile - In the same manner; sim.
Cadenza - Grand solo or extra flourish

Ad libitum - As you'd like; ad lib
